#### BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE

- ☐ The BIVSP provides meaningful exposure to research for veterinary students.
- ☐ It has been instrumental in raising awareness of careers in biomedical research.
- ☐ The program provides a mentoring opportunity in 10-12 weeks of research on the bench organized at/by a North American vet school which can be defining in the career of a future scientist.





#### BI VETERINARY SCHOLARS PROGRAM: KEY POINTS

- ☐ Veterinary students preferably in their **first or second year of veterinary school** are encouraged to apply.
- At each participating institution, BI scholars are assigned to a mentor and laboratory.
- From May to July/August each scholar conducts a **hypothesis-driven** research project developed jointly by the scholar and mentor.
- ☐ At the end of the program, scholars present their findings to their fellow scholars and attending faculty.
- ☐ Scheduled activities provide opportunities for the students to **learn** about the broader aspects of research.



#### NATIONAL VETERINARY SCHOLARS SYMPOSIUM



- □ 3-day symposium where veterinary students present the **results** of their summer research.
- ☐ The NVSS is the **premier annual scientific colloquium** showcasing research accomplishments by veterinary students completing summer research internships.
- ☐ The Symposium highlights the ways veterinary scientists advance basic and applied research to support global health.
- □ Poster presentations from veterinary students are featured throughout the meeting, together with keynote speakers and sessions on scientific and career-related topics.



#### THE INTERNATIONAL PART OF THE BIVSP

## Established in France (4 vet schools) and the Netherlands (Utrecht) since 2010; Germany since 2018

- ☐ Three French and three Dutch students each are selected by the vet schools in their home country for participation in the BIVSP at a North American vet school based on the evaluation of their application and an interview.
- ☐ In 2018 **vet schools in Germany joined the program for the first time,** sending students to US schools.
- □ 2020/2021 no international exchange linked to COVID-19 pandemic
- □ 2023 Pilot to expand program to Asia (Japan and Philippines)

#### FRAMEWORK FOR THE INTERNATIONAL PART OF THE BIVSP



Current level of funding per BI-funded student is \$6,500 total for the summer program at school.



- ☐ It is **the students' responsibility** to purchase their international air travel from the stipend given and arrange for housing at the US School (N.B.: often supported by the host schools). It is also the students' responsibility to cover their airfare and hotel to attend the Veterinary Scholars Symposium.
- ☐ The vet schools in the participating international countries have a **BI representative** as their contact.
- □ In each country there is one **School Program Director** in charge of coordinating the participating local vet schools, organising the student selection and providing the link between BI and the student.
- ☐ It is recommended for the BI representative and the School Program Director attend the **2023 NVS Symposium in Puerto Rico.**



### PRE-REQUISITES TO BE MET BY INTERESTED STUDENTS

- ☐ Ideally 1st or 2nd year veterinary students (details dependent on country-specific curriculum)
- ☐ Motivation letter for a training in veterinary research (in English)
- ☐ Curriculum vitae
- ☐ A good level of academic performance ("good students")
- ☐ A good level of English
- ☐ No prior BIVSP experience in the US, Canada or Europe



Student selection\* is the responsibility of the vet school - BI does not get involved



<sup>\*</sup> It is advised to short-list several students in case the one selected for the stipend for some reason has to renounce the research training.

## INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM **GUIDELINES**

- ☐ Prepared for the international students and the School Program Directors to explain and facilitate the exchange process
- ☐ Updated November/December each year to take into account the experience of the previous year





#### International Students participating in research training at a North American Veterinary Schools

#### 1. Nominations

- BIVSP School Program Director: each home school should appoint a local faculty member that will serve as the main contact with BI's International Program Director (Brigitte contact info) and participating student(s).
- At the American host university: the mentor for the research project you have chosen, once identified, must inform the school's BIVSP Program Director and also bring the student into contact with the school's international Relations Department.

#### 1.1 Personal and health insurance

Students are expected to have personal insurance for activities outside the research training, e.g. civil liability, and to ensure International health coverage (including repatriation).

Student must have an international credit card that will allow him/her to pay their expenses, make withdrawals, etc. in the United States (NB: check what is covered by your credit card insurance (ex: repatriation)).

#### 1.2 VISA

International students participating to the BIVSP research training at an US vet school will need to obtain the appropriate visa for their stay in the US. We strongly advise students to get in touch with the Office for International Affairs at the US host school as soon as possible after they will have identified their research project and mentor.

#### 2.2 Stipend

Each yet student, who has been selected by his/her school/faculty to participate in the BIVSP, receives a stipend between \$U\$ 5000-6000. The totality of the stipend will be provided to the student by the BIVSP Program Director of the home school or directly transferred to the student's bank account before he/she leaves for the US. The funds for that are expected to arrive at each school in April.

The students are expected to pay for travel, housing, meals, transportation, visa fees, trip to the embassy and other day to day expenses. The host school may assist the students in finding appropriate accommodation for the period of their stay in the US. The expenses for that and the daily life have to be covered by the student from the \$U\$ 5000-6000 stipend she/he has received through his/her home school prior to leaving for the US.
