



Call for Applications: TiHo Young Researcher Support (TYReS) Doctoral Scholarships of the Foundation of the University of Veterinary Medicine Hannover

TiHo Young Researcher Support (TYReS)

The Foundation University of Veterinary Medicine Hannover (TiHo) invites applications for doctoral scholarships within the **TiHo Young Researcher Support (TYReS)** programme.

The programme aims to support outstanding early-career researchers pursuing a doctoral degree (Dr. med. vet., Dr. rer. nat. or PhD) at TiHo by enabling them to conduct innovative, high-quality research projects.

Eligibility

Applicants must

- demonstrate outstanding academic achievement,
- have obtained their qualifying university degree generally within the last two years,
- have secured supervision by an eligible supervisor,
- conduct their doctoral research at TiHo.

Scholarship

The scholarship comprises

- a monthly stipend of **€1,600**
- and a monthly research allowance of **€150**.

Funding is granted for an initial period of two years and may be extended by one additional year following a successful progress evaluation.

Application Documents

Applications must be submitted as **one single PDF file** and include:

- project proposal (maximum 3 pages)
- university degree certificate
- Europass CV
- motivation letter including career plan (maximum 2 pages)
- reference letter from the future supervisor
- confirmation from the head of the institute regarding the availability of infrastructure and resources.

Selection Procedure

Applications will be evaluated by the TYReS Selection Committee based on academic excellence, scientific quality and the innovative potential of the proposed research project.

Top-ranked applicants will be invited, together with their supervisor, for an interview.

The final funding decision rests with the Selection Committee.
